ROLE PROFILE

Post	Student Councillor
Role type	Part time, voluntary basis
Term	November 2021 – June 2022
Time commitment	3-5 meetings per term, plus flexible volunteer hours

Outline of the Role

Student Council is the highest representational body of the Union. The role of Council is to set the Student Policy of the Union, hold your Executive Committee to account and provide political oversight. Meetings take place once in the first term and twice in the second term.

Student Council is made up of three Councillors from each of the five Schools here at City.

Responsibilities:

- To be an member of Student Council and represent the students in my School and their views in meetings of Student Council
- To consult with students in your School in between meetings of Student Council so that you can faithfully represent their views
- To attend Student Council Training and take advantage of development opportunities associated with the role.
- To hold executive officers and the executive to account for their actions as political office holders.
- To abide by the policies of the Union, including the constitution, regulations and policy duly passed and currently standing policy of the Union, until such time as that policy is lapsed or changed.
- To abide by equality legislation and treat my fellow councillors and Executive members with respect and courtesy.
- To take an active role in Union decision making as a member of the Student Council, exercising the powers of Student Council, including approval of Policy.
- To engage students in the work of the Students' Union, including encouraging all students to take part in Student Union democratic processes.
- Where appropriate to engage in Student Union campaigns as set out by the Executive Committee, particularly where these have been approved by Student Council.
